Metis Child, Family and Community Services (MCFCS) is a mandated child and family services agency with the responsibility to administer and manage culturally appropriate community based child protection and support services for Metis, Non-Status and Inuit people in Manitoba.

One to One Worker (Competition #2011-0809E-OTO) Multiple Positions

The One to One Support Workers will provide short term one on one intensive support through a structured program, mentor and teach anger management and conflict resolution to youth; work with youth and caregivers in their home and in their community to establish safety networks. Redirect to more positive peers and role models and how to deal with peer pressure. Redirect in a positive manner to return to school and assist in job searches. Documentation skills are critical. Hours worked are flexible, including evenings and weekends.

Key Responsibilities and Activities

- Provide short term one on one intensive support to youth ages 8-17
- Mentor and teach anger management and conflict resolution
- Work with youth and caregivers in their home and in their community to establish safety networks
- Redirect to more positive peers and role models and how to deal with peer pressure
- Assist youth to maintain attendance and/or return to school and assist in job searches

Key Qualifications

- Current CPR and Emergency First Aid,
- Non-violent Crisis Intervention
- Knowledge of child development and behavior
- Grade 12 is desirable
- At least 2 years working with "at-risk" and vulnerable youth
- Child and Youth Care Diploma, Family Support Worker FAS/E Certificate and other related schooling and/or experience is an asset

Prior to commencing employment, you are required to provide the results of a Criminal Record Check and consent authorizing the Agency to conduct a Child Abuse Registry Check and Prior Contact Check.
