- 5 – Outstanding (e.g., exhibiting a distinguished degree of professionalism and accomplishment)
- 4 – Above average (e.g., demonstration of above average teaching abilities)
- 3 – Average or satisfactory (e.g., identifiable weaknesses are offset by strengths)
- 2 – Below expectations (e.g., specific problems are identified that overshadow strengths)
- 1 – Unacceptable (e.g., serious problems are identified which require prompt attention)
