**8. TEACHING**

**(a) Areas of special interest and accomplishments**

1	<p><i>Building a New Program in Psychiatry</i></p> <p>Forensic psychiatry has recently been recognized by the Canadian Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons as a new area of specialization (Bourget, 2010). I co-developed and teach a research methods and academic scholarship course for psychiatry fellows and new forensic psychiatrists. I also mentor new psychiatrists and direct care staff at the Forensic Psychiatric Services Commission (FPSC) in completing scholarly projects and obtaining graduate degrees. I fully anticipate that the Department of Psychiatry, UBC will rapidly become a top-ranked school for obtaining training in forensic psychiatry and look forward to helping to further shape our program and provide mentorship to scientific practitioners. Given that the department of Psychology, UBC no longer provides forensics as an area of training, yet forensic practice is a burgeoning area in psychology and many other mental health disciplines (nursing, criminology, law, sociology) I anticipate we will be able to attract a multidisciplinary student body.</p>
2	<p><i>Mentorship</i></p> <p>I am responsible for research mentorship of graduate students, postdoctoral fellows in psychology, and psychiatry fellows. The success of my students is evident in their capacity to attract grant funding and awards, their records of publication, as well as our graduates being sought after for academic appointments upon graduation. For instance, my former student received numerous local and international awards (see below), in particular, she was named the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada’s (SSHRC) top postdoctoral fellow. Dr. Desmarais went on to accept a faculty appointment at the University of South Florida. I also currently mentor a postdoctoral fellow who received funding from both the Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research and SSHRC to continue our work on resiliency and recovery in mentally ill individuals who come into conflict with the law. As further evidence, another post-doctoral fellow working with me (C. Wilson) currently has one of the most highly cited papers published in the <i>International Journal of Forensic Mental Health</i>.</p>
3	<p><i>Integrating Scholarship and Clinical Practice</i></p> <p>I have taken a lead role in developing a highly active and productive department of research at the BC forensic psychiatric hospital. I am the only full-time Senior Researcher at the Forensic Psychiatric Services Commission and work in close collaboration with our scientific director Dr. J Brink. I am responsible for integrating scholarship and practice within our services and we have attained considerable success in a relatively short duration of time. I consult widely within our service (e.g., Riverview Hospital closure; \$100 million redevelopment of the Burnaby Centre)</p>

I have co-authored several measures that have been widely implemented into clinical practice and large programs of research (North America, Europe, Australia, etc). In order to facilitate rigorous implementations and evaluation research I co-developed extensive training packages that include materials on theory and empirical rationale, detailed descriptions of the measure, items and coding guidelines, case vignettes, 'gold-standard case coding solutions', research findings, and recommendations for implementation success. I present this information regularly at invited workshops (see below).

2.	<p><b>Risk Assessment:</b> I have published extensively on assessing and managing risk in mentally ill and justice involved populations (i.e., suicide, violence, crime). Our first article (<i>Journal of Consulting and Clinical Psychology</i>, 1999) co-authored with K. Douglas, J. Ogloff, has been cited 374 times (Google Scholar). In 2004, I published the first study (<i>Behavioral Sciences and the Law</i>) to examine the validity of two prominent violence risk assessment measures (HCR/PCL:SV) with women. This paper was the top cited article in 2004-05 and in the top 25 articles cited between 2000 and 2006 (cited 154 times to date). It was noted to be a “hot paper” by <i>Behavioral Sciences and the Law (BSL)</i> and garnered me a Brain Star award from INMHA-Canadian Institutes of Health Research. Additional evidence includes: (1) Invited lectures (e.g., US/Canada judges) and workshops (&gt;85, many international); (2) consultant to government organizations (e.g., Correctional Service of Canada; Pinel Institution; BC Probation; BC Corrections; the Home Office, UK); (3) Co-edited three special issues of journals (w J. Petrila, C. de Ruiter); and (4) 2004 <i>Canadian Psychological Assoc. President’s New Researcher Award for Early Career Achievement</i> and (5) Served as an expert witness (<i>Inglis v. HMTQ</i>) and provided affidavits for the court (<i>Bacon v. SPSC; Gregory v. Washington Corrections</i>).</p>
3.	<p><b>Knowledge Translation &amp; Supporting Evidence-Based Practice:</b> I have co-authored measures widely adopted into clinical practice. The Short-Term Assessment of Risk and Treatability (START, 2004, 2009) has been translated into 8 languages (e.g., French, Norwegian, Finnish, Dutch, German). I have conducted &gt;80 invited talks and training workshops globally, sponsored annual international meetings, consulted on the development of an electronic START, and an associated treatment and management guide. I co-lead the implementation of START across the BC Forensic Psychiatric Services Commission (190 beds + 6 community clinics). Colleagues in MN, AB, BC, Nfld, QC, the US (CT, GA, OR, CA, FL), Ireland, England, Finland, Australia, Scotland, etc are undertaking implementations and research with START (49 publications to date). In every respect, START has evidenced considerable promise as a tool to bridge the gap between research and practice. I brought together a team for an adolescent version (2 manuals) and lead the development of the abbreviated START:AV (7 publications ).</p>
4.	<p><b>Provision of Services to Mentally Ill Adults in Conflict with the Law:</b> I have co-authored 14 government reports (Correctional Service of Canada, Justice Canada, BC Provincial Health Services Authority etc). I am first author of the <i>Jail Screening Assessment Tool (JSAT)</i>, w/R. Roesch, M. Olley, J. Ogloff, J. Hemphill), a manualized mental health screening program (i.e., assess mental disorder, suicide/self-harm, violence/victimization). It has been implemented in all pretrial and federal reception centres in BC. I am the research consultant to the director of mental health services for BC Corrections. I am consulting with ON (S. Simpson) on the implementation of JSAT to enhance service delivery and research in their new mega-jail (10,000 admissions annually – initiated 2014). The JSAT has been evaluated in 4 prospective studies. I am first author of a peer reviewed article, which won me my 3rd Brain Star award from INMHA-CIHR. I received the 2004 <i>American Psychological Association Award for Distinguished Professional Contributions by a Graduate Student</i> for implementing and evaluating JSAT in a women’s prison in BC.</p>
5.	<p><b>Domestic violence</b> has occupied much of my scholarly interest. I have published a manual, a book, 11 articles and 11 chapters. I received a <i>Brain Star award from INMHA-CIHR</i> for a first author article (w/ D. Dutton). I developed and tested an ecological risk-needs measure of women’s decision-making in abusive relationships that is being used in large-scale DV interventions and evaluations in Sweden (A. Tengström), the Netherlands (C. deRuiter), and Spain (E. Hilterman). The <i>Decision-making in Abusive Relationships Interview (DIARI)</i> helps mental health and justice professionals identify women at greatest risk of revictimization, to guide safety planning and treatment. I co-edited a book (J. Hamel) on gender-inclusive research and treatment under contract with Springer. The book received excellent reviews and culminated in a conference. I have since developed these materials into a new graduate course (e.g., was invited to deliver the course as a visiting lecturer at Maastrich University, The</p>

	Netherlands). I provided affidavits to the court Gregory v. Washington Corrections. Most recently, I was honoured with the Chad Buckle Visiting Fellowship in large part for my work in this area; I will be spending several days travelling around New Zealand to give invited lectures, workshops and media interviews.
6.	<b>As of March 2016</b> I have co-authored 33 book chapters and 64 peer-reviewed articles, 2 books, 12 professional manuals, and 19 government reports. I have given 40 invited talks, including 12 plenary lectures and 294 presentations at peer-reviewed conferences.
7.	<b>As of March 2016</b> I have received \$13 million in scholarships, grants, and awards. I have had virtually seamless salary awards since being a master's student (SSHRC/MSFHR) until the present (MSFHR/CIHR). In addition, I hold multiple grants from CIHR as well as operating grants from the University Medical Research Fund – Institute of Mental Health Research, and the Mental Health Commission of Canada. Most recently I received a Foundation grant in CIHR's inaugural competition (7yrs of research funding; in stage 2 my application ranked 133/1366 of all Canadian applicants).

### (h) Other Scholarship or Education Activity

My colleagues and I have had considerable success in developing diverse programs of research and scholarship that have resulted in rapid uptake into clinical practice, I have outlined specific areas of knowledge exchange successes below:

#### *Tertiary Psychiatric Services and Riverview Hospital Redevelopment.*

- I am the PI on a CIHR funded study of the final cohort of Riverview Hospital Patients to be moved to community care. This is a large program of research, to date, I have collaborated on four projects examining the implications of closing BC's only tertiary psychiatric hospital.
- Our findings are challenging several widely held misconceptions and providing essential information for health services planning and direct care providers.

#### *Violence Risk Assessment.*

- I am co-leading, with Dr. Kevin Douglas, a CIHR funded prospective study of dynamic risk variables in close collaboration with BC Corrections. Data collection is being conducted across 4 provincial jails and 4 Community Corrections sites.
- I have worked in a clinical capacity with male and female clients in federal and provincial correctional settings and in jails assessing violence risk. Several of my studies have evaluated the clinical relevance of violence risk assessment measures and their psychometric properties, in civil and forensic psychiatric settings, respectively.
- I have also co-authored six clinical manuals and over a dozen publications that pertain to violence risk in civil, forensic, and correctional populations. In particular, I am regularly invited to train diverse mental health professionals (nurses, psychiatrists, psychologists) in risk assessment and have provided lectures for the forensic psychiatry didactic teaching series for forensic psychiatric residents on violence risk assessments.
- I am assisting in the development of the first set of standardized reporting guidelines for violence risk assessment research. These guidelines will assist researchers in developing more methodologically rigorous studies with more clinical utility.

#### *Domestic Violence.*

My work in this area is intended to ensure evidence-informed assessments, management and safety planning for families living with abuse and violence. Our work has focused to some extent on debunking myths about intimate partner abuse, challenging the gender-paradigm and educating professionals about the limits of current intervention approaches. The reality of domestic violence is that it presents a tremendous burden on the physical and mental health and needs to be considered a public health priority.

- Received a Brain Star award from the Institutes of Mental Health and Addictions of CIHR for an article on intimate partner abuse (w/D. Dutton).
- Developed and tested an ecological risk-needs measure of women's decision-making in abusive relationships. The *Decision-making in Abusive Relationships Interview* (DIARI, Nicholls, Hilberman, & Tengstrom, 2010) is intended to be used to screen women at risk for abuse by an (ex)-intimate partner. The measure is used to determine identify women at risk of revictimization and inform therapeutic and safety planning. It is expected to have relevance to police, advocates, shelter staff, and mental health professionals, alike.
- Co-edited a book (w/ J. Hamel) on gender-inclusive research and treatment in abusive intimate relationships, under contract with Springer. We were most fortunate to attract contributions from many

of the world's most renowned experts in the field (Drs. M. Straus, J. Babcock, D. O'Leary, D. Dutton, N. Graham-Kevan, I., Frieze). The book has received extremely favourable commentaries and critical acclaim, being touted by leading experts as 'a ground-breaking, must read for students, clinicians, legal professionals, and the judiciary, alike'.

- Co-authored three systematic reviews including research on intimate physical partner violence since 1990 as part of an edited book and special issues of the journal *Partner Abuse*
- Invited to deliver three plenaries in 2011 related to my work in this area (Canadian Institutes of Health Research – Gender Institute, Montreal QC; International Assoc. of Forensic Mental Health Services, Barcelona, Spain; Australia and New Zealand Association of Psychiatry, Psychology and Law, Melbourne, Australia).
- Invited to teach a course as an international expert on the topic by the Faculty of Psychology and Neuroscience, at Maastricht University, The Netherlands.

#### *The Provision of Mental Health Services to Inmates.*

Another area of interest involves the provision of psychological services in jails and prisons. The criminal justice and correctional systems have become the de facto gateway to mental health services in many countries, including Canada. As such we have considerable challenges in providing adequate mental health screening to prevent suicide, violence, victimization and self-harm.

- I am regularly consulted by provincial, federal and international correctional settings. For instance, I have co-authored three reports for the Correctional Service of Canada. In 2010, I consulted on the seclusion of a high profile inmate in BC Corrections and the suicide of Ashley Smith in a federal prison.
- I am first author of the *Jail Screening Assessment Tool* (JSAT, Nicholls, Roesch, M. Olley, J. Ogloff, J. Hemphill), which describes a mental health screening program (i.e., to prevent mental health deterioration, suicide, self-harm, violence, and victimization) that has been implemented in all pretrial centers in British Columbia (BC).
- Consulted with BC Corrections on the implementation of the JSAT measure across the province and the development of an electronic JSAT as part of their larger health web-form.
- The JSAT has been evaluated in two prospective studies. I am first author of one related peer reviewed article which won me my third Brain Star award from INMHA-CIHR. I am the only trainee, to date, to receive this prestigious award on three occasions. I received the 2004 *American Psychological Association Award for Distinguished Professional Contributions by a Graduate Student* in recognition of being instrumental in the development and implementation of a mental health screening program at the Burnaby Correctional Centre for Women, evaluating/publishing a validation study of the program, and for publishing the JSAT. I was a co-applicant on a grant that supported a PhD dissertation (Gagnon, 2009), to further test the statistical and practical properties of the JSAT.

#### *Strengths, Resiliency and Recovery and Holistic Mental Health Assessments.*

- Co-edited special issue of *International Journal of Forensic Mental Health*
- Co-authored the first risk assessment and treatment manual to guide mental health professionals to provide balanced assessments that consider both protective factors and risk factors.
- Currently co-leading a study of recovery and strengths in forensic patients who are and are not successful upon obtaining conditional discharge from the hospital. To date, the project has supported an honour's thesis, master's thesis, SSHRC Postdoctoral fellow building on this program of work.
- My interest in risk assessment and risk management has also expanded to include a holistic evaluation of patient needs in order to inform day-to-day clinical interventions and treatment planning. Research with our patients at the BC Forensic Psychiatric Hospital and other large-scale studies demonstrates that there is considerable overlap across patient safety concerns (e.g., patients who are aggressive are also at elevated risk to self-harm; patients who take unauthorized leave are at risk of substance use that can escalate risk of suicide/violence/reoffending).

#### *Homeless and Mentally Ill Persons – Mental Health Commission of Canada's At Home/Chez Soi Project*

- Upon invitation from the national PI (Dr. P. Goering) and the Vancouver PIs (Drs. Julian Somers, M. Krausz, and J. Frankish) I am co-leading the forensic mental health aspects of the National 'At

Home/Chez Soi' Study of Homelessness with Dr. Anne Crocker (Quebec). This five city study will be the largest project of its kind worldwide. The study will evaluate the housing first approach using a RCT.

Dr. Crocker and I are consulted on the measurement and inclusion of items related to examining victimization, involvement and interactions with authorities and the criminal justice system, impulsivity, and family violence. We will be taking a lead role in the dissemination of these findings over the next several years. I am particularly interested in contextualizing the nature of participants' contacts with police, which prior research demonstrates often is of a supportive and positive nature. In addition, I will bring a gender lens to the data, examining, for instance, the extent to which the etiology of homelessness reflects child abuse/domestic violence experiences differentially for women.

Unfortunately, however, most psychiatrists receive minimal training in research and scholarship. I co-developed a course on research methods that I co-teach with Dr. James Livingston to Psychiatry Fellows at the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital. I also mentor residents and fellows in critically evaluating the literature, preparing conference presentations, and engaging in collaborative or independent research, depending on their interests. We expect this will become a core course in the new forensic psychiatry specialization (see below).

Developing a World-renowned Training Program in Forensic Psychiatry.

Forensics is now recognized as an area of specialization in psychiatry by the Canadian College of Physicians and Surgeons. I firmly believe our department is poised to take up this opportunity and become 'the place' to go for an education in forensic psychiatry. I am eager to continue to collaborate on the development of an internationally renowned fellowship in forensic psychiatry and support a multidisciplinary training program for diverse mental health professionals to obtain training in forensic psychiatric services and risk assessment.

Developing a Rigorous and Stimulating Training Program with Direct 'Bench to Bedside' Applications

- When I began as a postdoctoral fellow at the Forensic Psychiatric Hospital in 2005, I was the only fulltime researcher-academic. In close partnership with our scientific director, Dr. Johann Brink, I have spearheaded a rich training program and a small but highly productive research department is emerging. We are integrating research into the fabric of our organization to ensure that patients receive evidence-based care and psychiatry trainees and graduate students have diverse and challenging education and research training opportunities. I now oversee a vibrant and highly productive research department. My students and I hold operating grants and salary awards from the Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research, the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, and the Mental Health Commission of Canada.
- In collaboration with our scientific director, I have now trained virtually every staff member who provides direct care in risk assessment. We integrate trainees in local and international training workshops and research opportunities and disseminations.

Graduate Student Supervision / Trainee Mentorship

- At any one time I co-supervise ~25 research trainees and students ranging from undergraduate students completing honour degrees to PhD students, postdoctoral fellows, and psychiatry fellows.
- We produce top-notch students who regularly are awarded national and international awards and ultimately go on to other universities to complete further training or move into professional positions as scholars.
- As a demonstration of the productivity and success of our trainees and my own work, I am now attracting students from abroad requesting to work under my mentorship as evidenced by three

requests from international students, coming from stellar mentors and programs (Drs. Sheilagh Hodgins, England; Corine de Ruiter, the Netherlands; David Cook, Scotland).

### Faculty Mentoring

Forensic psychiatrists who are clinical trainees and who have no research experience regularly come to me for support in completing graduate training and research projects.
