**POLICY:**

Upon successful completion of the required Pre-Nursing/Pre-Psychiatric Nursing courses, students can apply and be considered for acceptance into their respective programs. Requirements for admission to Year II of the BN/BScPN programs include a minimum grade of “C” for each of the required Pre-Nursing/Pre-Psychiatric Nursing courses and an Admission GPA of 2.5 or higher.

Applicants must be at least 18 years of age by the application deadline. The deadline to submit the following documents/requirements for applications is May 1<sup>st</sup>.

- Completion of Pre-Nursing/Pre-Psychiatric Nursing courses with a minimum grade of “C” in each course, and an Admission GPA of 2.5 or higher
- Completed Casper Testing
- Application form/
- Completion of the Brandon University Immunization Record (available from the Student Advisor). It is recognized that 3 doses of the Hepatitis B vaccine will take approximately nine months to complete, therefore only two doses are required by May 1<sup>st</sup>. Documentation of the remaining 3<sup>rd</sup> dose/antibody testing will be required as discussed with the respective Student Advisor.
- Satisfactory completion of a Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Search, a Manitoba Adult Abuse Registry Check and a Manitoba Child Abuse Registry Check. Third party Criminal Record Checks are not accepted. Positive checks will be managed through the Criminal Record Check/Child Abuse/Adult Abuse Registry Policy.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must present proficiency in English by providing evidence of achieving acceptable scores on the language test as per the Faculty of Health Studies English Language Proficiency policy.
- Proof of completion of a University-level Indigenous course or completion of an Indigenous course from an approved list (see Faculty website).



Failure to submit the above requirements by the May 1<sup>st</sup> deadline will result in an incomplete application. Incomplete applications will not be considered for admission into the respective programs. Students may choose to apply in a subsequent year with a completed application.

Admission to the BN/BScPN program is based on the following:

- Grade Point Average (GPA) in the Pre-Nursing/Pre-Psych Nursing courses (70%)
- Casper test results (30%)

The BN program accepts up to 60 students per year. The BScPN program accepts up to 35 students per year at the Brandon Campus, and up to 60 students per year at the Winnipeg Campus.
