## **Compassionate Care Leave**

Effective June 1, 2016, the provincial Employment Standards Code was amended to provide leave from work to employees to provide care or support to a gravely ill family member.

Brandon University will provide unpaid leave for Compassionate Care Leave of up to twenty-eight (28) weeks in accordance with the following:

- 1. An employee wishing to take Compassionate Care Leave:
  - a. Must have been employed for at least ninety (90) days,
  - b. Must normally provide at least one pay period notice,
  - c. Must provide, as soon as possible, a copy of the physician's certificate (specific for this purpose) that states an employee's family member has a serious medical condition with a significant risk of death within twenty-six (26) weeks and the family member requires the care or support of one or more family members,
  - d. Is eligible to maintain all employee benefits during the period of leave by paying both employer and employee premiums in advance of the leave, and
  - e. May not take more than two (2) periods of leave totaling no more than twenty-eight (28) weeks, No period of leave may be less than one week's duration.
- 2. Unless the University and the employee agree otherwise, the employee may end the leave earlier than the approved expiry date by giving the University at least forty-eight (48) hours' notice of the expected date of return.
- 3. At the end of the employee's leave, the University shall reinstate the employee to the position the employee occupied when the leave began or to a comparable position with no less than the wages and any other benefits earned by the employee immediately before the leave began.

**Definitions** for the purpose of this policy:

"family member" shall be defined as the employee's child or the child of the employee's spouse or common-law partner, the employee's spouse or common-law partner, the employee's father/mother, the spouse or common-law partner of the employee's father/mother, or any other person who is a member of a class of persons prescribed in the regulations for the purpose of this definition.

"common-law partner" shall be defined as a person who has been living in a conjugal relationship with that person for at least a year.

"care or support" means providing psychological or emotional support, or arranging care by a third party, or directly providing or participating in the care.
