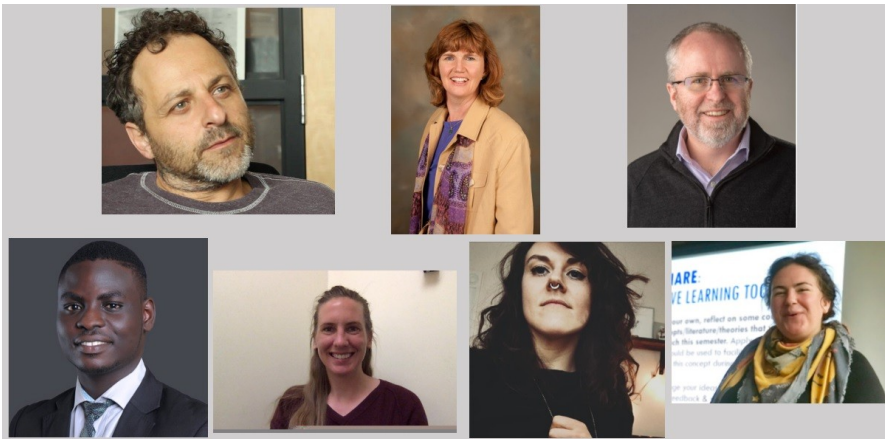

ABSTRACT

Work Integration Social Enterprises (WISEs) are a policy approach of social enterprises supporting vulnerable community members excluded from the labour market. A 3-year nation-wide study evaluates sustainable livelihood outcomes for WISEs at a Michelin Tire plant in rural Nova Scotia, in Vancouver and homebuilding training programs in Manitoba's First Nations.
