Bruna Gonçalves Costa will be providing a *Public Talk* highlighting the findings from DATALUTA, a digital database managed through a network of 27 research groups across the Brazilian academic community. DATALUTA has been used to collect, analyze, and systematize nation-wide broad-based Indigenous movements in Brazil to re-assert their fundamental human rights such as access to education, health care, language recognition, cultural preservation, and, most importantly, securing land rights.
