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## WORKFORCE STATUS IN MANITOBA

Based on the workforce status report of Manitoba in December 2020, right after the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic, the unemployment rate in Manitoba was 8.3% whereas the employment rate was 59.7%. In December 2022, the unemployment rate dropped by 4.1% and the employment rate rose to 63.7%.

In November 2023, Statistics Canada released crucial insights into the immigrant workforce landscape in Manitoba, providing insights into the employment dynamics and self-employment sectors that significantly engage immigrants within the province. This comprehensive data release serves as a valuable resource for understanding the integral role of immigrants in Manitoba's labour market and provides a detailed overview of their involvement in various sectors of the economy.



## NAICS Sectors of Employment by Immigrants in Manitoba (Statistics Canada 2023)

In 2023, the workforce landscape continued to exhibit distinct patterns of occupational distribution based on gender, reflecting the diverse career choices made by men and women. The industries in which individuals choose to pursue employment play an important role in shaping these demographics. Data analysis based on the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) showed that certain sectors attracted a higher percentage of male workers, while others witnessed a predominant representation of female employees.




Figure 1: Employment vs Unemployment in Brandon, Manitoba
