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


Let's Get Started


 You will not be permitted to check into your residence room if First Term fees are not paid. All students who are sponsored or waiting on student loans should contact our office with this information, prior to your arrival. Payments made via online banking, wire transfers or using a 3rd party payment option, after August 15 should also send the confirmation of payment receipt to residence@brandonu.ca as the payment may not reach your BU account in time.
- **Purchase your Parking Pass:** If you have vehicle, you can apply online for parking . Information on Parking can be found at https://www.brandonu.ca/parking/
- Be sure to purchase renters insurance to protect your belongings.



Where do I unload my vehicle for move-in?


You can unload your vehicle in parking Lot 1 or the available street parking on Louise Avenue and 20th Street. There will be Residence Staff to direct traffic and give directions.

Where can I park?

Once the vehicle is unloaded, Students moving in can park in Parking Lot 5, 6, 7 or 10. Please note that after move-in weekend parking passes will be required. Information regarding when to purchase parking will be available soon.



Your Room



In Your Room:

- Bed
 - ◆ Twin XL (McMaster and Flora Cowan Hall)
 - ◆ Double (Darrach Hall)
 - ◆ Queen (McMaster Hall Queen Rooms)
- Desk
- Chair
- Wardrobe (Flora Cowan Hall/ Darrach Hall)
- Dresser (McMaster Hall)

In reference to the Residence Agreement, residents are not permitted remove residence furniture from their rooms and any furniture removed will be considered missing and the replacement value of that furniture will be charged to the student.

Most rooms offered as a Standard or Standard Plus occupancy will have double sets of furniture, since they were designed as double occupancy rooms. We suggest taking advantage of the extra furniture in the room to customize your space to how you like it.

Depending on your room and roommate situation, you may find that space could be limited. We recommend speaking with your roommate to coordinate what each of you will contribute to your new living space.

What To Bring with You

We only Allow the Following Appliances:

- CSA Approved Microwave
- ♦ CSA Approved Toaster
- CSA Approved Kettle
- ◆ CSA Approved Keurig style coffee pot
- CSA Approved Mini fridge (max. 4.0 Cubic Feet)
- ♦ CSA Approved Blender
- *We ask that only one cooking appliance be plugged in at any one time.

We Suggest you Bring:

- Flip Flops for the shower
- ◆ Toiletries (Toothbrush, Floss, Mouthwash)
- ♦ Pillows, Sheets, Comforter, Towels
- Kitchen utensils and small set of dishes Laundry Detergent
- Laundry Bag
- Sticky Tac for posters and pictures.
- Posters/Décor
- Clothing Hangers
- ◆ Laptop or Tablet
- ◆ Printer
- Tupperware
- ♦ Surge Protector Power Bar
- Clothing for all seasons
- School Supplies

You May Also Want To Bring:

- Hair dryer
- Plants
- Can Opener
- Desk lamp
- Over the door mirror
- Board Games/Gaming System

You Cannot Bring:

- Hot Plates/Electric Grills/Deep Fryers
- Explosives/Firecrackers
- Subwoofers/Amplifiers
- Halogen Lamps
- Nails or Tacs
- Pets
- Weapons
- Items that promote unsafe alcohol consumption
- ◆ Decorative candles, incense, potpourri burners, and flammable liquids.
- Non- residence provided furniture and mattresses



Checking In

Check In Steps

- 1. Our Check-in Hub will be located in Harvest Hall (#6 on the campus map, page 4). This is where you will check into residence before you move your belongings.
- 2. There will be designated parking for residents on moving day. Closer to your move-in day, you will be sent directions to your email account on where to park. There will be signs to direct you, and you can also refer to our campus map.
- 3. A member of our Residence Staff Team will meet you to greet you and assist with your check in.
 - —> If you've prepaid your first term residence charges, you'll immediately receive your check-in package, including your room key and Student ID. You're ready to move in!
 - -> If you haven't paid for your first semester
 - residence fees and haven't made prior arrangements with the Residence Office, the resident must make their residence payment before they can complete their check in.
- 4. Once you have your check-in package, a member of our Residence Staff Team will give you directions to your room. Once there, you will be asked to complete the room check form (that lists the condition of the room), sign for your keys, and sign other important documents that may have been missed before your arrival.

A few things to keep in mind:

We will continue to email important documents - please check your emails for the most up to date information on check-in.

We ask that you arrive no sooner than 10 minutes before your selected check-in time – volunteers will be available to guide you in the right direction.

Please remember to move your car as soon as you have unloaded it to allow others to also move in.

Residence Orientation and Move-in Weekend Events!

Moving away from home and starting University classes can feel like a huge mountain to climb. Residence Orientation is designed to give you a big advantage as a new student by connecting you to your new communities and providing you with the opportunity to develop a network of support. Living with Roommates

All shared rooms are provided with a roommate agreement to be completed by all roommates. It is mandatory for all shared rooms to complete a roommate agreement. It is very important to fill out this online roommate agreement because it is always the first step in our processes when conflicts arise and it's best to have one at the start to be proactive and hopefully prevent conflicts. It is intended to provide a basis for roommates to communicate and share living space.

Residence Services

Parking

We do offer guaranteed parking for all of our residence students. Parking is at an additional cost to the student and is not included in your housing and meal plan fees.

Registration for parking will be available later this summer. To register for parking please go to our Online System at https://brandonu.ops-com.com/ You will need to "create an account", register your vehicle, and then send an email to parking@brandonu.ca to notify us of your Username.

Your Username will then be approved once we confirm your registration in residence and you can then proceed to purchase your parking permit online or at our office upon check in.

Mail Boxes

Your mail box key will be included in your check-in package you will receive upon arrival. We will provide you with your box number for your address. Mail boxes are located on the ground floor of McMaster Hall. Mail is sorted at the Ancillary Office, Mondays through Fridays.

Larger packages are left at the Ancillary Office to wait for pick up. A parcel slip is sent to the students' mail box, for notification. If you leave residence in April students must change their address to the preferred address of their choice, even if you are planning on coming back to residence in the fall. Residence Services

Internet Access

Wifi access has now been integrated into all 3 residence halls, so there is no need to bring a wireless router or Ethernet cable. You should receive a email with your unique WIFI Access Code prior to your check in. If one was not sent to you, or you have misplaced it, you can send an email to helpdesk@brandonu.ca.

Mini Fridge Rentals

Residents can rent a mini fridge from the residence office for an eight month contract (September to April). To rent a fridge please complete and submit an application with payment to the residence office. Please note we have limited supplies.



Other Services

Parents Need to Know



During this time of transition for your student, we highly encourage you to keep in contact with them to see how they are doing; however, Brandon University Residence cannot contact the student on your behalf, nor can we discuss details about a student without direct consent due to Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Legislation. Therefore, it's very important that you discuss with your student how and how often you want to communicate with them throughout their stay in residence while respecting their schedule. Upon check-in, the student can sign a "Release of Information" form to allow an individual or organization access to their information.

As a parent, family member, or guardian, your support for your student adds tremendous value and increases the odds of their academic and personal success here at Brandon University. We encourage discussions between you and your student about:

- Personal safety
- Budgeting and expenses
- Encouraging your student to ask questions to develop independence and enhance decision making skills

It's also important to remember, as your student goes through the many challenges of being a university student, to be calm and reassuring to your student throughout their time at Brandon University; these challenges are normal and your student can overcome them with grit, determination, and by having the support of their loved ones. Also note that a drop in grades is normal through this transition as well, so encourage your student to seek academic support.
