**Notice of Motion** 

THAT Senate approve that the following statement be read slowly and respectful at the beginning of each meeting of Senate (including sub-committees) after the meeting is called to order:

"Brandon University acknowledges that its campuses in Brandon, Dauphin and Winnipeg are located on Treaty No. 1 and 2 territories. These are the traditional territories for many Indigenous peoples whose relationship to the land creates a rich heritage for our learning community. We acknowledge the wrongs of the past and while we did not personally commit the atrocities, we work to repair relationships and create equity within our everyday lives. As part of the TRC and UNDRIP, we take this time to thank the Indigenous peoples' who walked before us and recognize the importance of their history and future on these lands and in our lives."

Consultation regarding this motion will take place with community elders, the BU IPC, the BU Indigenous Education Committee, and the Brandon Urban Aboriginal Peoples' Council (BUAPC).

#### 5.8. Report from the Board of Governors Representative to Senate (Sen. Boyd)

Senator Boyd reported on the following:

- The terms on the Board of Bea Jolly and Jim Kilpatrick came to a close, and Caroline Stitt, Trudy Corbett, Ethan Strain and Katie Kerkowich have been appointed to the Board as Orderin-Council members. Round table introductions were made.
- Dialog Representatives gave a presentation on the Brandon University Campus Master Plan.
- Brandon University hosted a public event with a very high-profile speaker on May 9th. Edward Snowden, the controversial American intelligence officer now living in exile in Russia, spoke live to audiences at BU, UofW, and U of Lethbridge on the theme of government and corporate mass surveillance and the role of universities in assessing the ethics of mass surveillance. This opportunity arose for BU after the UofW was able to engage Snowden for its Axworthy Distinguished Lecture Series.
- The Board of Governors approved the following at its March meeting:
  - the purchase of The Strand Theatre property for the price of \$1.00.
  - in principle, the Agreement to acquire access to 901 Princess Avenue, 144 and 136 on 9th Street in Brandon from the Brandon Downtown Development Corporation for one dollar (\$1.00).
  - the Agreement to acquire access to 156 on 9th Street in Brandon from the City of Brandon for one dollar (\$1.00).
  - the changes to the Ethical Considerations in the Administration of Awards Policy.
  - the Brandon University Sexualized Violence Policy.

- At its May meeting the Board of Governors approved the following:
  - the 2017 2018 Operating Budget (including the 2017 2018 Fee Schedule and budgets relating to Renovations & Equipment, Eckhardt-Gramatte Conservatory of Music, Ancillary Services and Campus Manitoba), as recommended by the President
  - the allocation of unrestricted endowment funds for the Faculty Research (BURC) & Entrance Scholarships
  - the Brandon University Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) and Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada (SSHRC) General Research Fund (GRF) Policy.
  - the applications for Sabbatical Leave as recommended by the President.
- The Board of Governors appointed the following members to the following Boards:
  - Foundation: Ethan Strain Student Rep, Trudy Corbett OIC Rep
  - Status of Women Review Committee: Katie Kerkowich OIC Rep
  - Finance and Audit: Emily Simon Student Rep

## 5.9 Report from the Brandon University Students' Union (BUSU) President (Sen. Brown)

Senator Brown reported on the following:

- The new BUSU Council began their term as of May 1, 2017. Senator Brown introduced Ms. Emily Simon, Vice-President Internal.
- BUSU will be recruiting students to fill the vacant positions on Council.
- They will be hosting a BBQ for the PENT students.
- They have begun the planning for Orientation 2017.

# 5.11 Report from the Vice-President's (Academic & Provost) (Sen. Robinson)

Senator Robinson reported on the following:

- He reported that there were approximately 220 individuals in attendance at the May 9, 2017 public event with Edward Snowden and that the event was very well received.
- There were a number of Brandon University members in attendance at the C2U expo. The Expo focused on campus and community engagement.
- The Dauphin outreach program will continue for another year, and administration of the program will now be part of Dr. Heather Duncan's portfolio.
- On April 7, 2017, Senator Robinson was part of a meeting that included Brandon University, Assiniboine Community College, members of the Brandon School Division, and Indigenous leaders. There was discussion regarding Indigenous students' experiences with the University and what their communities and students are looking for when attending post-secondary.
- He attended the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. John's College, a predecessor of the University of Manitoba.
- A new Strategic Enrolment Management (SEM) Committee has been struck, with Ms. Deb Berkan, Director, Institutional Data & Analysis, as Chair. The goal of the committee is to bring into relation all of the data and perspectives that bear on the nature of the student experience at University and beyond. What do we want student success to look like and what do we need to do to achieve the goal? What size of university do we want? Ms. Berkan will have a presentation for the June 13, 2017 Senate and will be administering a survey for Senators at that time.

# 5.12 Report from the President (Dr. Fearon)

### Dr. Fearon reported on the following:

• Brandon University's Convocation will be held Friday, May 26, 2017, and he invited all Senators to attend to celebrate our graduating students.

- On April 28, 2017, the Minister of Education and Training and the Minister of Sport, Culture, and Heritage made an announcement relating to Bill B-15. Brandon University's recently approved Sexualized Violence Policy addresses the items discussed in B-15. There were a number of speakers at the announcement including Dr. Fearon, the President of the University of Manitoba, and students. Dr. Fearon expressed his appreciation for all the members of the Brandon University Sexual Assault Advisory Group for their work on drafting the policy.
- The recent 2017-18 provincial budget included a 0% operating grant increase for the Manitoba universities. The operating costs of Brandon University increase by approximately 3% annually, and so this short fall in funding will need to be found through cost-saving initiatives. It was announced earlier that institutions are permitted to increase tuition up to the rate of inflation (1.3% in Manitoba) for the 2017-18 year.
- There is a retreat being planned for the Board of Governors that may include integration between the Board and Senate.
- Dr. Fearon has been discussing capital projects with the government, and this included a new Science building as well as a number of other items.
- He recently attended the Mayor's State of the City address which included a number of references to Brandon University.
- There has been progress on the downtown initiatives, including discussions regarding community gardens.
- He thanked Senator Tryphonopoulos for his work in bringing the Black Canadian Studies Conference to campus and Senator Robinson for his work in bringing Edward Snowden to campus via webcast.
- He informed the Senate that the Government of Manitoba is performing audits on all postsecondary institutions.
- As this was the last meeting for a number of Senators, Dr. Fearon thanked them for their time and service to the University and Senate.
