Requests for readmission will be considered jointly by the appropriate Faculty/School Dean, the Registrar (or designate), and the appropriate Faculty/School BUSU Senator (or, in the event of a BUSU Senator vacancy, a member of the BUSU Executive). Joint decisions may be appealed to the Curriculum & Academic Planning (CAP) Committee, the decisions of which are final.

3.15.3.4 ACADEMIC WITHDRAWAL

Students will be placed on Academic Withdrawal if, after having been readmitted from Suspension they have:

1. Failed in a subsequent session to meet the minimum academic performance requirement for all credit hours attempted to date.

Failed to obtain a minimum of a 2.0 grade point average on courses taken during the academic year.
 Accumulated more than 48 credit hours of F's and/or repeat courses.

Such students will be required to withdraw from the University for a minimum of 36 months and must formally reapply to the University in order to be considered for readmission (see Section 2.1). Requests for readmission will be considered jointly by the appropriate Faculty/School Dean and the Registrar (or designate). Joint decisions of the Dean and Registrar (or designate) may be appealed to the Curriculum & Academic Planning (CAP) Committee, the decisions of which are final. If readmitted, such students will be on Academic Probation.

5.6 Report from the Board of Governors Representative (Sen. Mumin)

Senator Mumin reported on the following:

- The last meeting of the Board of Governors was November 25, 2017
- The Provincial Government has appointed five new members to the Board Kerry Auriat, Jason Gobeil, Grant Jackson, Robyn Sneath, and Brad Zander

5.7 Report from the Brandon University Students' Union (BUSU) President (Sen. Brown)

Senator Brown reported on the following:

- On October 25, 2017, the Student Union held a rally in opposition to Bill 31 with over 200 students in attendance. Senators Brown and Hodgins traveled to Winnipeg after the rally to speak against the bill at the Government hearings. Despite a large number of individuals speaking against the Bill, the Bill was passed by the Provincial Government.
- The food bank received around 3000 pounds of donations from the Halloween food drive.
- He reported that feedback from students regarding the new Fall Study break has been positive. They used the time to catch up with assignments and reading. However, some students stated that the break was too late in the term.
- He thanked the cleaning staff of the University for removing any offensive stickers and posters that are being put up on campus.
- BUSU will be hosting the annual student holiday dinner for 75 students on December 20, 2017. Senator Brown thanked the VP (A&P), President's Office, and Student Services for their donations.

• BUSU has begun planning for Winter orientation and Mental Health Week.

5.8 Reports from the Deans', University Librarian, and Registrar

5.9 Report from the Vice-President (Academic & Provost) (Sen. Serfaty)

Senator Serfaty reported on the following:

- Dr. Bernadette Ardelli will begin her new role as Dean of Science beginning on January 1, 2018.
- He thanked Senator Gulliver for his willingness to continue in the role of Acting Dean of Science for two years of consecutive 6-month terms during the decanal search.
- His office is still working on the Dean of Students search; the posting will be released shortly.
- The office is also working on the review of the Dean of Education and the University Librarian.
- The Public History program has been forwarded to the Provincial Government for approval, and the University should get a response in the next two to three months.

5.10 Report from the President (Dr. Robinson)

Dr. Robinson reported on the following:

- He and Senator Duncan traveled recently to The Pas to sign an MOU with Opaskwayak Cree Nation (OCN) Education Authority regarding the Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Education Integrated degree program being offered in the OCN community. He reported that the Cree language will be an important component within the program. This will not only help to keep the language alive in the community, but it will help the students when they graduate and become teachers. The Education Authority will be helping to provide BU students with many of the resources needed to be successful.
- He attended the Business Council awards night in Winnipeg and was impressed with the level of funding the Council offers to Indigenous students in order to help them complete their studies. Students were given the opportunity to share with attendees how these awards have impacted their lives while attending post-secondary studies.
- He also attended a presentation by Dr. C. David Naylor regarding the final report of Canada's Fundamental Science Review: Investing in Canada's Future Strengthening the Foundations of Canadian Research. The report demonstrates that the Federal Government of Canada is providing less money for research when other countries are increasing their funding. Due to the cuts in federal funding, provincial governments are now effectively funding education and research.
- A coalition from Brandon University attended City Council and presented the Campus Master Plan. The city was in support of the plan and requested that all major institutions in Brandon supply a master plan.
- He also attended the Throne Speech by the Provincial Government, and the Government reiterated the need for academic programs that will feed demands from the Labour Market. They are also interested in completion (graduation) rates for all post-secondary institutions. When considering program and infrastructure proposals, value for money will be a primary evaluation criterion.
- A delegation from Dalian University, including their Vice-President of the University, recently visited BU. For 20 years there has been an agreement between BU and Dalian University wherein faculty members have traveled to the other institution in order to participate in various activities.
- Recent registration numbers indicate that, as of December 15, 2017, BU's enrolment has increased by 9% over last year at this time.
