# 4.2. Senate Scholarship Committee (Sen. Gatien)

THAT Senate approve the new Terms of Reference for the Madryga Family Classical Guitar Scholarship.

Two awards will be made annually:

- (a) One award shall go to an Eckhardt-Gramatté Conservatory of Music guitar student on the recommendation of the Conservatory Scholarship Committee. Preference will be given to a guitarist who participates in a solo classical guitar class at the Brandon Festival of the Arts. If there is no deserving guitarist, the scholarship may be awarded to one of the following (listed in order of preference): a Brandon University School of Music classical guitarist or a Brandon University School of Music jazz guitarist. This award may be shared.
- (b) One award shall go to a Brandon University School of Music classical guitar major on the basis of academic performance. Priority will be given to the classical guitar major who is undertaking Suzuki guitar teacher training at an approved Suzuki teacher-training event. Students in an approved guitar teacher-training program must provide documentation of such with their application for the award. If there is no deserving guitarist, the scholarship may be awarded to a Conservatory classical guitar student. This award may be shared.

Award Value: Use income allocation, approximately \$300.00\*.

One-third of the income allocation will be provided to the recipient(s) of award (a), and two-thirds of the income allocation will be provided to the recipient(s) of award (b). As the size of this fund and the number of qualified candidates grow, the awarding body may, at its discretion, choose to change the 1/3 - 2/3 ratio as circumstances warrant.

\*The award value is subject to change based on market values and the BU Foundation's distribution rate

- They meet with student groups and administration on November 9, 2018 to discuss the white supremacy posters that are appearing on campus.
- They will be hosting a graduate student meet and greet on November 13, 2018.
- Senators Hodgins and Shannon attended the Canadian Federation of Students meeting from November 15 – 20, 2018.
- The BUSU AGM will be held on November 27, 2018.
- They will be hosting a part-time and mature student meet and greet on November 30, 2018.
- They have begun planning the annual Christmas dinner, which will be held on December 19, 2018 for those students who will not be traveling home for the holidays.

#### 5.6 Report from the Vice-President (Academic & Provost) (Sen. Serfaty)

Senator Serfaty had no report at this time.

## 5.7 Report from the President (Dr. Robinson)

#### Dr. Robinson reported on the following:

- On November 9, 2018, Dr. Robinson unveiled the first of many TRC posters that will be
  distributed around campus. The poster highlight some of the 94 recommendations and Calls to
  Action on education from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's final report.
- Dr. Robinson attended the Department of Philosophy retreat that focused on programing and
  the future needs of the department. He noted that he is excited to be teaching one course next
  term.
- He attended a pre-budget consultation with the Minister of Finance where he expressed BU's need for capital investments not only for buildings but for non-building items as well.
  - o BU is in need of an Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system in order to continue to meet the University's IT needs and to better serve students, faculty, and staff.
  - The University has received no signs from the Provincial Government that they
    would assist in funding the ERP system, so the University may have to fund it on its
    own
  - The University is in the final stages of hiring a consultant who will help to determine the University's needs and identify the system that will best meet these needs.
  - This will be a long-term project of up to 10 years involving an investment of time and human resources as well as money.
- He attended a reception for the annual meeting of the Canadian Association of Graduate
  Studies in Winnipeg and spoke with the presidents of University of Manitoba and University
  of Winnipeg. Dr. Robinson used this opportunity to inform participants about Brandon
  University and our graduate program offerings.
- He laid a wreath on behalf of BU at the November 11, 2018 Remembrance Day event in Brandon. He used this opportunity to invite a veteran who is also a BU student, Patrick McBurnie, to join him.
- Dr. Robinson, Derrick Stewart, and Kristen Fisher will be attending a Universities Canada conference in December. The theme of the conference is Safeguarding University Autonomy. He will report on the convention at the next regular meeting of Senate.
