4.3.4. Teaching on Campus for the fall – discussion

There was discussion by the committee regarding the delivery of courses during the Fall 2021 session and items that should be considered.

- What will social distancing rules be like in September?
- How much of the population will have received vaccinations?
- Will current classroom be large enough to meet the social distancing requirements?
- Chairs of the Faculty of Arts have met and have had the discussion and they feel that September would be too soon to offer courses on campus.
- What will the cleaning protocol for classrooms be after each class?
- Students will be looking at registering for Fall classes and how they are to be delivered could be a deciding factor of if they will continue their education next year or take a year off.
- Students need to be included in the discussion.
- Problems and gaps from this last year must be solved moving forward

- If courses are to be delivered on campus where will the larger classes be held.
- The University needs to direct more recourses to Student supports. Students are missing the social interaction of on campus learning.
- BU should have conduct a survey of our students
- There should not be a hybrid of course delivery. Students may have issues with having an online class and then their next one on campus how will they make it their campus course and not be late.
- Representative from BUSU reported that students are dealing with more stress with online exams more than the classes being virtually.
- Education students in the two year after degree could graduate without every being on campus at all.

4.3.6.1. Mandatory Indigenous Education Course Requirement

THAT the Senate approve that a minimum of 3 (three)credit hours of Indigenous education is required for every undergraduate and graduate degree at Brandon University. On the model of liberal education requirements. AND

THAT Students will chose from a list of approved courses.

There was a discussion that included the following:

- All members of Senate were in agreement in principle with the motion, however they have a number of concerns.
- The committee was concerned with the burden that could be placed on the department of Native Studies to meet this requirement.
- The individuals that deliver the indigenous courses need to be very knowledgeable in indigenous culture.
- Indigenous instructors need to be in support of this requirement.
- How will these courses be included in student degrees.
- Hiring of a individual who would have the capacity to teach these courses only.
- If BU wants to indigenize the student experience then requiring one three hour course into the degree requirements will not accomplish that.
- The University of Winnipeg initiated a program two years ago that each student is required to take some indigenized course content. The IEC contact the University of Winnipeg to see how there program is working.

4.3.7. Report from the Brandon University Students' Union (BUSU) President

Senator Maxon reported on the following:

- BUSU had a successful snowientation. We collaborated with BUGA to have a virtual
 game night where students could play games, have fun, build community and meet
 other BU students. We received a lot of positive feedback through Discord,
 Facebook, emails; and BUGA had new signups on their Discord server as well.
- BUSU also had a virtual yoga session as part of snowientation and we had a fair turn out. Possibly because students had classes at that time.
- BUSU partnered with UTILE to conduct a survey to see what housing challenges students are facing and hope to use the result to better serve students and help them find better housing.
- BUSU is celebrating Black History month properly for the first time. Throughout the month, we will be highlighting Prominent black people and their achievements in the advancement of black people. We also partnered with a BU student to run a weekly podcast talking about black issues especially black mental health and the stigma behind it. We will also be having a zoom meeting with the president of the newly formed collective Racialized collective (formed October 2020) to talk about black history.
- BUSU started a monthly meeting with the president of the university and we are looking forward to our discussions.
- BUSU is currently running its annual election and as such some senate/council
 members have taken a leave of absence to run. The election will end on Feb 26th,
 2021 at 4:30pm.

Music - Senator Gatien

- School of Music has two faculty searches underway.
- Registration opened on Friday for the Music Enrichment Program. This program is and online outreach program to provide some high quality music instructions to students in the public school system.
- There are four pro-series in the next two months Aaron Wilson, Daniel Tselyakov former student, Cathy Wood & Nancy Hennen,
- Music graduate students are organizing an online community celebration of their music making achievements over the year where they are unable to see each other.
- They have had responses from current and graduated international students organizing outreach to international communities.

Education - Senator Duncan

- VP Research The committee adjudicated NSERC awards for undergraduate awards. There seven awards given as well as two indigenous awards.
- There were 27 BURC awards submitted by faculty, the committee did not give out there total budget but this could be due to the impact that COVID 19 has had on research.
- In Education Faculty Students will be beginning their final placements in two weeks.
- Education has four searches underway.

Health Studies – Senator Ross

- They currently have two searches underway.
- Health Studies students are in the process of receiving their COVID 19 vacinations.

Dean of Students - Senator Gross

- The Indigenous Peoples' Centre in partnership with the Faculties will be hosting various virtual events for Indigenous Education Month from February 14-March 21.
- The External Review for Student Services should begin late Spring.
- Recruitment is hosting an Indigenous Sponsor Day on March 3, 2021.

CIO - Senator Sucha

- As health orders in Manitoba continue to change, Library & IT Services maintains its operations in a mainly virtual capacity, with some essential services available on campus (study spot/workstation appointments, contactless book pickup).
- IT Services completed a firewall replacement on January 30. This change enables greater reliability our network, already mitigating one major outage from our partners on February 15 from impacting BU's IT environment.
- The Library and Archives received funding from the Research Office that is being applied towards digitization of Manitoba Elevator Pool Records, the Brandon Sun, and Indigenous newspaper collections.
- The Library has released a new virtual book display for Freedom to Read Week Feb 21-27.
- The Library provided support to the Diversity and Human Rights office in gathering a bibliography of works by Black authors to support Black History Month events.

University Registrar - Ms. McDaniel
