- Student Services has started the new Student Advising Program and currently 124 students have booked appointments.
- In-person recruitment visits have resumed in the schools.
- Campus tours have resumed at BU and are led by students.
- BU is working with ACC and the Brandon School Division to host an Indigenous celebration barbeque, scheduled for next Wednesday.
- A year-end celebration was held recently for the Al and B. Wagner Indigenous Student Transition Program for 26 students.
- Student Services, as a cohort, completed the Pulling Together workshop.
- BUSU and Senator Gross hosted the Black Student Mental Health Toolkit Information Session virtually on April 19<sup>th</sup>.
- BU is reinstating the primary care clinic on campus, which will be accessible every other Wednesday starting in June.
- Mini University is operating again this summer.

Senator Ardelli reported on the following:

• Congratulations to this year's graduates!

Senator Spence reported on the following:

- The Faculty of Arts has received three faculty resignations. Students have already been enrolling for courses for 2022/2023, and the Faculty is working diligently to ensure that students enrolled for courses are not disadvantaged by these resignations.
- There is some advancement on the reinstatement of the certificate program in Business Administration. More information will be shared as it becomes available.

Senator Sucha reported on the following:

- The Library resumed services to community borrowers with the BU's move to Phase Gold.
- The Indigenous Services Librarian Search is still underway.

Senator Gatien reported on the following:

• A wonderful memorial celebration of life was held for Dr. Glen Carruthers at Wilfrid Laurier University; Brandon University was well represented at the event.

- The Eckhardt-Gramatté National Music Competition was held on April 23 and 24<sup>th</sup>.
- Terry McMaster has returned to her full-time responsibilities in the School of Music after having spent the entirety of the academic year working alongside Human Resources and Information Technology Services on the vaccination portal and testing verification protocols for the University. Senator Gatien thanked T. McMaster for taking on this important task. He also thanked Ms. Joyce Burba and Ms. Bobbi White for assuming T. McMaster's work during this time.
- The School of Music recruiting outreach team organized an incredibly successful event called Centre Stage.
- Professor Megumi Masaki was named to the Order of Manitoba.

Senator Duncan reported on the following:

- PENT students are currently on campus. The sessional instructors for the program met recently to talk about strategies for teaching courses that are intensive and compressed.
- A former faculty member in Education recently passed away Professor Emeritus Pandelis Halamandaris.
- The Faculty of Education has hired three sabbatical replacements.
- Some integrated program students who missed practicum hours due to COVID-19 are currently finishing their practicum experiences.
- Dr. Ruth Knechtel recently started as the new Research Officer in the Office of Research Services.

Senator Ross reported on the following:

- The Master of Psychiatric Nursing program admitted five new students. However, 12 of the 17 qualified applicants were not admitted because of unavailable resources.
- The Faculty of Health Studies is currently advertising for 12 positions, some of which are part of the expansion project.
- Renovations are underway in the Faculty of Health Studies buildings at the BU and Winnipeg campuses.

Senator Campbell reported on the following:

- The President's anti-racism task force met for the first time last week. It was a great first meeting and enthusiastic beginning.
- He is currently working on the staffing criteria report.

- He extended thanks to Deans' Council for their work done over the academic year to date.
